

Physicians: percentage of female and male





Nurses: percentage of female and male








Women Health Workers by Age Group





The History of Women Doctor



- Maria Emilia Thomas (17 February 1896 10 October 1966), or better known as Marie Thomas, was the first Indonesian woman to become a physician
- Completed her studies at STOVIA in 1922 and was acknowledged as the first female graduate of STOVIA
- specialized in obstetrics and gynaecology and is considered the first Indonesian doctor to specialize in this field.
- She established a midwifery school in Bukittinggi, West Sumatra






Disease burdens are different between men and women.

Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, road injuries and HIV/AIDS feature in the 10 leading causes of deaths among men, but not among women. Alzheimer's disease, hypertensive heart disease and breast cancer feature in the 10 leading causes of deaths among women, but not among men.


10 leading causes of death among men and women²⁸






Road injuries, cirrhosis of the liver, HIV/AIDS and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease figure in the 10 leading causes of DALYs lost among men, but not among women. Iron deficiency anaemia, diarrheal diseases, back and neck pain and asthma feature in the 10 leading causes of DALYs lost among women, but not among men.


10 leading causes of DALYs lost among men and women²⁹

Health Minister Asks for Speedy Judicial Review in Ayu Case

Jakarta (Antara) - Health Minister Nafsiah Mboi has urged for a speedy judicial review in the malpractice case against Dr. Ayu and her associates that has triggered demonstrations in many places across the country. "We hope the Supreme Court (MA) will process the judicial review quickly so that the case can be seen clearly," the Minister said at a press conference on Wednesday. Nafsiah stated that she would not intervene in the process but would take the help of medical experts as witnesses in case it was needed. "Our task is to give a technical explanation with regards to the medical aspects of the case so that the MA can give as fair a ruling as possible," she noted. The Minister has also asked for the suspension of the detention of the concerned doctors, in order to allow them to carry out their respective duties. "We hope that these doctors will be allowed to carry out their duties during the judicial process. I guarantee that they will not try to escape," she said. Nafsiah said doctors were sworn to dedicating their lives to humanity and so she believed that no doctor intended killing his or her patient. "No one would become a doctor with the aim of killing people. Certainly their only intention is to save one's life," she reiterated. (*)

Indonesia: New law on maternity and paternity leave

On 4 June 2024, the Indonesian House of Representatives passed the Draft Bill on Mother and Child Welfare for the First One Thousand Days of Life (**Mother and Child Bill**), which enhances maternity and paternity leave entitlements.



	Manpower Law	Mother and Child Bill
Duration of maternity leave	Live birth female employees are entitled to 1.5 months' leave prior to childbirth and 1.5 months' leave after childbirth the Elucidation to the Manpower Law provides that the leave may be extended based on medical certificates, but is silent on the duration and payment during such extended maternity leave Miscarriage 1.5 months' leave	Live birth female employees are entitled to at least 3 months' leave after childbirth extendable by another 3 months where there are medically certified special conditions (eg childbirth complications) Miscarriage 1.5 months' leave
Wages during maternity leave	Full pay	 Live birth full pay for the first four months 75% of usual salary for the fifth and sixth months. Miscarriage Full pay

	Manpower Law	Mother and Child Bill
Paternity leave	Two days' paid leave for live birth or miscarriage.	Two days' leave for live birth (may be extended by another three days or by agreement) or miscarriage.




